### RECTOR'S LETTER: *THOROUGHLY THRILLED*

Dear St. Stephen's,

Hopefully you have received word that St. Stephen's will resume in-person, in-building Sunday services beginning with Pentecost, May 23! This has been a tremendously anticipated occasion, and I am thoroughly thrilled to see this come into fruition. I am extremely thankful for your patience and willingness to be flexible over the past year as we have maneuvered through this period of COVID exile from our beloved worship spaces. I can't express how excited I am to worship with all of you in the Chapel and the Big Church. It is definitely a long time coming and will prove to be an immensely joyful experience.



My anticipation reminds me of when I was a young child eager for an event to arrive. Each year, as a child, my most anticipated sleepless night was always right before the first day of summer camp. There was always a great amount of preparation needed to have a joyful safe experience before camp; making sure the bug spray and flashlight and enough clothes were packed. Similarly the Vestry, staff, and the Regathering Task Force will be working diligently to prepare a joyful and safe experience as well. I am extremely thankful for their leadership and thoughtfulness as we venture into a new chapter in the life of St. Stephen's. In the very near future, we hope to receive new and improved guidelines from the Bishop's office that will provide direction in creating that safe and fun environment. As we receive those guidelines and determine the appropriate administration of them, we will share that information with the congregation as soon as possible.

As you have probably surmised, summer camps have been a very important part of my entire life. I grew up attending the Diocese of Texas summer program at Camp Allen, beginning in 3rd grade as a camper, and when old enough serving as a counselor, resident senior staff, and eventually a director of my own session. Now that I reside in the Diocese of West Texas, I look forward to serving the summer program at Camp Capers. Interestingly, my camp buddy since 3rd grade and throughout life has been The Rev. James Derkits, rector of Trinity by the Sea in Port Aransas. Now that we are both serving in the same diocese again, we look forward to experiencing the summer camping program together. I am very excited and honored to share that James and I have been asked by Camp Capers to serve as the Spiritual Directors for the residential permanent staff this summer. This non-stipendiary position will entail an approximate weekly trip to Camp Capers to provide spiritual direction and a priestly presence for those serving the camping program throughout the summer. On Wednesday evenings, we will provide space for the staff to grow together spiritually with God through worship, group, and individual discussions, and fun activities. It is a great pleasure for me to provide assistance to the camp staff and to serve the Diocese of West Texas in this capacity.

Most assuredly there are some exciting things on the horizon for St. Stephen's in the near future, and for this I am extremely thankful. I continue to be encouraged and thankful for your enriching good hearted attitude and energy for St. Stephen's. This is truly a place in which God is revealed and praised. ## **TREASURER'S NEWS by Roy Buckley**

SSEC continues to experience solid results from its Pledge revenue stream, due in large part to several members who have chosen to make lump sum annual Pledge payments, rather than meeting their Pledge commitments on a monthly basis. During the month of February 2021, Lump Sum Annual Pledge receipts totaled \$16,500 and increased to \$21,000 during the month of March. Bearing in mind that lump sum annual payments will in fact diminish the stream of normally accruing monthly Pledge payments, we should expect normal monthly Pledge receipts to shrink as more Pledge commitments are made in a single lump sum payment. The stream, of normal monthly Pledge receipts in February and March, however, were somewhat robust. February monthly accruing Pledge receipts totaled \$24,052 and increased to \$29,282 in the following month of March. Total revenues for the month of February and March were \$41,034 and \$53,482, respectively.



Year-to-date cumulative revenues were \$221,069, slightly short of Budget.

The expense side of the Financial Statements of Activities continues to reflect upon the solid expense control and management procedures set by Parish Administration. February cumulative expenses were \$42,388 and for March were \$52,774. Both months bettered our Budget expectations by sizeable margins. A good example of Parish Administration's proactive approach to expense control is its current proposal to purchase the office copier/scanner and readjust the service and maintenance with the vendor, resulting in savings of more than \$400 per month. Kudos to our Administrative team: Jeannetta Watson, Lydia Baese, and Fr. Kevin Schubert.

The below Revenue/Expense schedule, in summary form, juxtaposes for comparative purposes financial activities during the months of February and March 2021.

In summary, one-off Pledge receipts and lump sum annual pledge payments continue to infuse the operating account with cash at an early point in the year. Normally flowing monthly revenue will contract somewhat in the succeeding months, tempering expectations that a robust flow of Pledge receipts will continue as the norm.


began his position as our new rector back in September 1, 2020.



**GARDENING ANGELS VOLUNTEER  
WORK DAY: SAT, MAY 1 @ 9:00 AM**

In Chapter 2 of The Acts of the Apostles, Luke tells us how Peter explained the gift of the Holy Spirit that descended upon the people of Jerusalem during Pentecost. Pentecost was a celebration associated with the Feast of Weeks, the beginning of the early wheat harvest. The significance of this event, which we will celebrate this year on Sunday,

May 23 cannot be overstated. Pentecost is particularly poignant to St. Stephen's this year as it marks not only the gift of the Holy Spirit, but also the day we will meet together as a congregation inside, face-to-face, for the first time in more than a year. This preamble tees up to a CALL TO PREPARE THE SANCTUARY (aka the BIG CHURCH).

**HELP PREPARE THE SANCTUARY WORK DAY  
SATURDAY, MAY 1, 2021 @ 9:00 AM**

The Great Freeze of 2021 took a toll on the plants that grace the entry to our Sanctuary, and we are asking for volunteers to repair the damage on Saturday, May 1, 9:00 a.m. Please let me know if you are able to come, [lazyboutpost3@aol.com](mailto:lazyboutpost3@aol.com).

Here's an inventory of what's needed:

- the two large pots to the right and left of the Sanctuary doors need new, low maintenance, drought tolerant plants. I propose *Kaleidoscope Abelia*, which changes its appearance seasonally and is an evergreen shrub. Is there someone that will sponsor one or both plants? Five-gallon plant cost is \$50-80 each.
- the Pineapple Guava needs to be pruned to the ground
- the Jerusalem Sage needs pruning back to allow new growth's access to light
- general weeding and pruning to remove dead limbs from trees and bushes
- one dead tree to the right of the walkway needs to be removed.

The small garden outside the back entrance to McArthur Hall needs some TLC as well. The good news here is that many of the plants survived the freeze and the work done to the stone back wall.

Here's what's needed for this area:

- an in-ground planting of a 3 to 5 gallon Butterfly Bush at an estimated cost of \$60 and two Salvia at \$35 each. Is there someone that will sponsor?
- pruning roses, muhly, agave, trees, bushes, and general weeding.
- mulching entire area.

On a related matter, going forward, we are looking to re-energize the Gardening Angels ministry. If you are looking for an opportunity to serve, as needed, without regular meetings, without committees or politics, and would like to do so in an environment

## ST. STEPHEN'S LECTORS: A WAY TO CONNECT AND SERVE

As St. Stephen's moves to in-person worship on Sunday, May 23, you may be looking for ways to be more involved in Sunday and weekday worship. During the pandemic, St. Stephen's Lay Eucharistic Ministry (LEM), has been assisting as Lectors for the Sunday live-streaming and Courtyard services and also with the Tuesday Morning Prayer service. We will continue in this capacity when services are in-person.

Lay people are an integral part of worship in the Episcopal Church. Lectors read the Lections and lead Prayers of the People (POP) on

Sundays and read lessons for Morning Prayer.

St. Stephen's will be offering Lector training this Spring before we move to in-person worship on Pentecost Sunday, May 23. We will be announcing the training date and time soon.

Lector training includes:

- access to readings and POP
- preparation of readings and POP before and day of service
- procedures for announcing readings and POP
- resources available including websites
- practice reading (use of mic, pacing, and connecting with congregation).

When training is completed, new Lectors are assigned to a team and mentor.
