VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The Vestry met on Monday, August 23, 2021. There was no July 2021

meeting. "The Treasurer's Report" from Roy Buckley showed income \$4,000 below budget, but expenses were \$21,000 below budget. So our finances continue to look good.

Our stewardship campaign will kick off in October. *The First Fruits Dinner & Gala* will be held at Old Glory Ranch on Sunday, October 24, 2021 and *Stewardship Sunday* will be on Sunday, October 31, 2021. Mark your calendars now!



A generous donor is funding many of the Gala's expenses, so we are expecting this to be both a profitable and FUN event.

Although we are currently holding one Sunday worship service <u>only</u> at 9:00 a.m., due to the wide spread pandemic spike in cases, other activities will continue as scheduled. This includes Youth Ministry and Christian Education. A revised schedule is included in this issue of *eNEWS*. Members of the Vestry continue to touch base by phone with parishioners to discuss the temporary change to one Sunday worship service and any other discussion items you wish to raise.

The next Vestry meeting will be held on Monday, September 27, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. and is open to all. That's it for now. I look forward to visiting with you after our September Vestry meeting.

TREASURER'S NEWS By Roy Buckley

The financial activities for the periods of June and July 2021 followed patterns familiar in years past, inasmuch as Pledge revenues appeared somewhat light in comparison to Pledge receipts recorded in January through May 2021. June Pledge receipts totaled \$28,915 and the July total was nearly identical, \$28,921. Cumulative Revenue for the months of June and July were \$35,093 and \$32,314, respectively. Notable was June's Plate receipts of \$4,528, well above the norm experienced throughout 2021 to-date. June's robust Plate revenue was a direct result of member enthusiasm brought about by Fr. Schubert's installation ceremony. Cumulative Revenues for each month fell short of Budget: \$1,542 short of Budget in June and \$4,321 short of Budget in July. Moving toward summer's end, as families return from travel and settle back into routine, we should experience revenue streams that approach anticipated Budget levels. We'll keep our fingers crossed and pray for some welcome and sustaining beneficence from our members.

The expense side of June and July's financial picture continues to reflect upon the solid expense control and management procedures set by Parish Administration. June cumulative expenses were \$56,766 (bettering Budget by \$657) and July cumulative expenses totaled \$41,896 (bettering Budget by \$3,316). Both months bettered our Budget expectations by sizeable margins. Applause, applause to our Admin team – Jeannetta, Lydia, and Fr. Kevin.

So, what do these numbers for June and July 2021 actually mean? Through July 31, 2021 SSEC is maintaining a Net Ordinary Operating Surplus (i.e., Inflows exceeding Outflows) of \$37,816, which is considerably better that we anticipated in our projections at the beginning of 2021. The below Revenue/Expense schedule, in summary form, juxtaposes for comparative purposes the financial activities occurring in the months of June and July 2021.
