# **Navigating Uncharted Waters** by The Rev. Kevin LJ Schubert



Dear St. Stephen's,

I want to express my deep gratitude for the warm welcome my family and I have received from the community of St. Stephen's. We have been blessed beyond measure, and we are extremely thankful to call this beautiful place home. It is an exciting time for our community, and I look forward to a time when we can celebrate more fully in person.

Each and every one of us in navigating uncharted waters as we live into a new reality amidst the current pandemic. Over the past several months our individual and communal lives have changed dramatically and will continue to change, but I know deep within my heart that the love that God has for each one of us has not wavered. God's continual presence remains, even in the midst of fear, anxiety, and the unknown. I want to assure you that as we begin to take small steps toward introducing in-person gatherings over the next few months, safety and responsibility will be our utmost concern.

Thankfully, we have a great amount of theology from our tradition to guide us at this time. We, as Christians, know a bit about sacrifice; as our religion is based upon the greatest sacrifice the world has ever known. I am reminded of these words from the Gospel of Luke said by Jesus.

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will save it. What does it profit them if they gain the whole world, but lose or forfeit themselves?"

- Gospel of Luke 9:23-25 I believe that at this time our calling, to take up our cross and follow Jesus, means working toward the health and safety of our communities. This requires much sacrifice on our part—wearing our masks, refraining from gathering in large groups, for some to shelter in place, and socially distancing. By sacrificing in these ways, we are losing a great deal in the near term, but in the long run we are literally saving lives. So, let us take up our crosses together and allow God to transform the world by doing our part for the well-being of the Kingdom of God. Our tradition informs us that the result of sacrifice is our redemption through resurrection. May God bless you, and surround you with his loving care. Peace.

## TODAY'S LAST DAY TO SIGN UP FOR 9/19 ROADSIDE CLEANUP




