
# UNWANTED MAGIC TRICKS: Missing Tables & Chairs!!!


In honor of your upcoming high school graduation accomplishment, your St. Stephen's church family would like to celebrate by giving you a Sending Off Ceremony and reception:

The mission of the Spiritual Retreat in Recovery is to provide a safe place to deepen one's spiritual journey. It is open to anyone in recovery from alcoholism or other substances, and to families and friends affected by the disease of addiction. Members of AA, NA, CA, ACA and Al Anon share their experience, strength, and hope in a community of love and support. The Rev. Brad Landry, Rector of St. Paul's in San Antonio, provides topical spiritual insight. Break out sessions focus on a variety of topics and activities. All friends in recovery are welcome. No church affiliation is required. Attendees will be treated to warm hospitality, delicious food, and thoughtful presentations in a beautiful hill country setting along the Guadalupe River.


